














Garden of






On December 22, 1962, the annual Christmas dance was presented by the class of 1963. "Peppermint Lane," carried the color scheme of red and white throughout the dance.




How can we ever forget the great slave auction? Surely this was an activity that we will always remember fondly and with smiles.
