

I will miss all the wonderful emotions and fabulous people I have worked with on this journey. I will not miss the stress. Producing any publication the size and scope of the THS Yearbook requires an enormous amount of work. I thank all the people who have done this over the last ten years.

Good luck to all those who will continue on with this endeavor, and to all those who will be just beginning.



As the floats paraded though town, school spirit was high. Returning to the football field to get their awards, students couldn't wait until halftime to see where their class placed.


Freshmen were awarded second place in the float building competition with the theme of "Monopoly." Sophomores came in third place with "Operation" as their theme.



THS Pays Tribute For 9/11

earing the strains of our National Anthem is a moving experience for many people. The solemn lyrics can bring a lump to the throat and a tear to the eye of a patriot even under the happiest of occasions. The "Star-Spangled Banner" at the beginning of an athletic event provides a moment of reflection to fans and players alike, but the song can seldom be imbued with the poignancy given it by the Tecumseh High School Choirs last Friday, Sept. 10.

After the routine clamor of students arriving and locker doors slamming, the usual hush of concentrating students descended on the building. A deeper hush fell, however, when Principal Bob Sheick cued the microphone on the public address system and asked that all teachers open their classroom doors for a moment of silence and a performance by

the choirs of our National Anthem. Even the faint murmur of teachers' voices intoning the day's lesson ceased with the announcement from the principal, and a deeper hush fell over the campus. Outside of the building, a clear and warm September morning called to mind a similar, briefly glorious fall morning in 2001.

Friday's crystalline autumnal sunshine poured through the tall windows at the south end of the school's corridor with an almost palpable goldenness.

Choir Director Donna Andre struck the opening chord of the anthem on a keyboard that had been set up for the occasion before the long line of choir students that stretched for the main part of the two-story hall, and the choristers hit the note flawlessly.

The sound of voices filled

the school and many a lump formed in students' and teachers' throats as thoughts turned not only to the words of the song but certainly also to the 3,000 souls lost in the national tragedy three years ago.

When the last echoing note faded from the phrase "...and the home of the brave," the choir members dispersed silently to their regular morning classes. It seemed that the deeper-than-normal silence lingered in the air long after the hall was deserted, but with it was a sense of peacefulness, a serenity, and a certain sadness that were tempered by the rays of sun still streaming through the windows.

Stepping out of the building, even the world seemed to have observed a moment of silence before continuing on its daily routine.

The sunshine had a bittersweet radiance that comes when summer is gone.




Powderpuff Football "Anything Gays Can Do, Girls Can Do Better!"




















The T-town Gymnastics Team increased in participants this year, going from 14 to 22 girls, with the addition of eight freshmen, and the loss of four seniors.




