



On October 1st, the Michigan Electronic Library (MeL) debuted a new site. Before launch, the Library of Michigan used feedback from communities around the state and members who evaluated different databases before redesigning their resources. The Library of Michigan needed to balance the acquisition of database resources for MeL while continuing to provide services and support for the diverse Michigan library community.

Based on the best cost, evaluation scores, library community input and surveys, some databases were dropped, replaced and added. A decision was made to move to a more comprehensive suite of products from EBSCO that fit within the allocated budget while providing a number of enhancements.

Some of the specific highlights of EBSCO's offering include replacing Heritage Quest with MyHeritage which is EBSCO's genealogy resource. A NoveList upgrade included both Novelist K-8 and NoveList Plus which was one of the most requested resources. Learning Express Library was upgraded, a 200,000 eBook collection was added as well as a substantial business collection.

Meet Libby to Download Books

The Overdrive Company is promoting their new app Libby yet still supporting the Overdrive app. Eventually, the Overdrive app will be phased out.

The process for checking out books and placing holds is basically the same across both platforms. One of the key differences is that if you have a title on hold, Libby will automatically download the book once it becomes available. This is especially helpful if you use more than one library. In Overdrive, you have to go to that particular library and manually download checked out holds.

Users owning Kindle Fires should use Overdrive

because Libby is not yet compatible with them.

The reading experience is only a little different between the two apps. Libby looks a little slicker and has a scale along the bottom to show where you are in the book. The settings are in slightly different places, but both share the same suite of fonts, lighting settings and



the ability to change the font size so you can read comfortably.

While Libby and Overdrive both tell you where you are in the hold line, Libby can estimate hold wait times. Libby is not yet multilingual, you cannot create a wish list or suggest a purchase. Libby will eventually offer these options at a future date.

It is up to the patron to use the app that will work best for them. While Libby does lack certain features, most agree that it is more user friendly and it is extremely easy to set up an account.
